

Philippe Bégin, MD, is currently completing his Clinical Immunology and Allergy sub-specialty training at the Université de Montréal. This fall, Dr. Bégin will begin a two year fellowship at Stanford University, before starting his clinical-scientist career at the Centre Hospitalier de l'Universite de Montréal and Sainte-Justine Hospital in Montreal, QC.
