Featured Speakers

Dan Bell has twenty years of management and joined Toastmasters in 1998 where he conducted numerous workshops on oral presentation skills. Dan achieved his Distinguished Toastmaster award in 2006. He competed in the semi-finals of the World Championship of Public Speaking in 2009.

Jacqui Brinkman, MSc, received her MSc at McGill University then spent several years working as a laboratory technician and in 2003 joined the UBC James Hogg Research Centre as Education Coordinator. In this role, she organizes education programs and manages the CIHR IMPACT Strategic Training Program for post-doctoral fellows. Jacqui has been the Programme A Coordinator for AllerGen since August 2009.

Donna Comeau, MSc, BSc, PhC, received her MSc from Dalhousie University in 1999. Donna is currently engaged as a Senior Policy Analyst for the Nova Scotia Department of Health and Wellness. Her health policy interests include health system accountability, primary care, patient quality and safety, health promotion and protection.

Michael Cyr, MSc, MD, is a practicing clinician-investigator at McMaster University. His clinical practice includes allergy and immunology, autoimmune diseases as well as general internal medicine. Dr. Cyr has recently completed the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons' Clinician-Investigator program studying cord blood stem cells as markers of atopic risk.

Krista has gained considerable experience in academic writing as she has several papers based on her honours, masters, and PhD research in peer-reviewed journals.
