Featured Speakers

Moshe Ben-Shoshan, MD, MSc, is an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at McGill University and a physician in the department of Allergy/Immunology at Montréal Children's Hospital where he is involved in several research initiatives on food allergies and anaphylaxis. He obtained his medical training in Tel Aviv, Israel before completing his fellowship in Pediatric Allergy/Clinical Immunology at Montréal Children's Hospital. Dr. Ben-Shoshan received the inaugural AllerGen Emerging Clinician-Scientist Fellowship in 2011 and is currently an AllerGen Principal Investigator on the Canadian Food Allergy Strategic Team (CANFAST).

Ann Clarke, MD, MSc, FRCPC, is a Professor in the Divisions of Clinical Immunology/ Allergy and Clinical Epidemiology in the Department of Medicine, McGill University. She was a Chercheur National of the Fonds de la Recherche en Santé du Québec and an Investigator of the Canadian Institutes for Health Research. She has received research support from the AllerGen Network of Centres of Excellence, the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, the Arthritis Society, the National Cancer Institute of Canada, and the National Institutes of Health. As a clinician-scientist with expertise in allergy/immunology, epidemiology, and health economics, Dr. Clarke's research focuses on the societal burden, quality of life, and morbidity associated with atopic and autoimmune rheumatic conditions. In 2012, Dr. Clarke received the Royal College Regional Mentor of the Year Award.

Lisa deMena Travis, PhD, is Associate Dean of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies and Professor of Linguistics at McGill specializing in syntax; Austronesian (Malagasy, Tagalog). Dr. Travis received her BA from Yale University and her PhD from Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). Dr. Travis is author of *Inner Aspect: The Articulation of VP (Studies in Natural Language and Linguistic Theory)*.

Jean-Marc Gélinas, BScH, is a Scientific Evaluator with the Food Allergens and Intolerance Assessment Section of the Bureau of Chemical Safety in the Food Directorate, Health Products and Food Branch, Health Canada. Jean-Marc received his BScH in Environmental Science with a specialty in immuno-chemistry from the University of Ottawa. Prior to this, he completed an Environmental Engineering Technician Diploma from Sault College.

Philip Gold, CC, OQ, MD, PhD, is a pioneer in cancer research and one of the most prominent clinical investigators in Montréal. His early research led to the discovery and definition of the carcinoembryonic antigen (CEA), the blood test most frequently used in the diagnosis and management of patients with cancer. Dr. Gold is the Douglas G. Cameron Professor of Medicine, McGill University, Professor, Departments of Physiology and Oncology, McGill University; and the Executive Director of the Clinical Research Centre of the Research Institute of the McGill University Health Centre. Dr. Gold has been elected to a wide variety of scientific organizations and received numerous international awards and honours. In 2010, Dr. Gold was inducted into the Canadian Medical Hall of Fame.

Diana Royce, EdD, is the Managing Director and COO of AllerGen NCE Inc. Dr. Royce obtained her BA (University of Waterloo) and MA (Queen's University) in Political Science and a Doctor of Education degree from the University of Toronto. Before becoming involved with the NCE program in 1998, she spent 13 years as a Senior Policy Advisor with the Ontario government specializing in post-secondary education and finance policy.

Peter Palmer graduated from Hautes Études Commerciales in Communication and Marketing and has over 25 years of instructional experience with Dale Carnegie Training. In addition, he earned a diploma in Radio & Television Broadcasting and was an anchor on national television for several years. Peter has coached many leaders in the pharma, medical and research sectors to present and defend their ideas in front of critical audiences and to deliver their important messages effectively.

David Préfontaine, PhD, joined AllerGen as a trainee at the beginning of his doctoral degree in Pathology at the Meakins-Christie Laboratories at McGill University, where he worked under the supervision of AllerGen Investigators Drs Qutayba Hamid and Bruce Mazer. Following completion of his PhD, Dr. Préfontaine worked as a Clinical Research Associate at Mount Sinai Hospital Centre in Montréal. Recently, he joined Novartis Pharmaceuticals Canada as a Medical Science Liaison.

Jesse Vincent-Herscovici, MA, is Director of Strategic Accounts and Business Development at Mitacs in Montréal. He obtained his Bachelor's degree in Organizational Psychology and his Masters in Human Systems Intervention from Concordia University.
